



INDEPENDENT STUDY COURSES FOR INSTITUTE

Purpose

Occasionally students are unable to attend a regularly scheduled institute of religion class.

Independent study courses are available to such students but should only be made available when circumstances warrant. These courses are not available for transfer credit to BYU but may be applied toward institute graduation.

How to Enroll

Students may enroll for an institute independent study course by personally contacting the local institute director or coordinator. Since this course is password protected, the instructor will either need to coordinate with enrolled students to give them access to the needed material, or give students hard copies of the lessons.

Course Requirements

Institute students who are enrolled in either regular classes or in independent study courses are expected to **read the entire block assigned to that course.**

Consequently, merely **reading the block is not sufficient work to merit independent study credit.** The time students spend completing independent study assignments is intended to be approximately equal to the amount of time they would spend in class in a traditional institute course. **The lessons in the independent study course consist of writing assignments that will be expected to be turned in to the instructor at regular intervals.** Therefore, all questions in the assignments require a written response. **No independent study credit will be given without completion of all required written work.**

Independent Study is hard work. It requires self-motivation and consistent work to get credit. Assignments must be e-mailed to the teacher by Friday of each week.

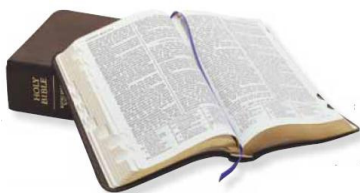
